Teacher Evaluator Initial Training #4001

AA #2001 is the ISBE required 2-day Initial Teacher Evaluation Academy requiring full participation both days and passing of the assessment on the afternoon of day 2. This training has been designed to assist participants in developing knowledge, skills, and dispositions necessary for effective teacher evaluation, and has been built around these competencies. The post-assessment is based upon demonstrating these competencies as well.

Preliminary work to gain familiarity with PERA Part 50 rules will be an element of the Academy. Implementation of the Danielson Framework for evaluation will be a focus of both days including developing and demonstrating interrater reliability, analyzing and using evaluation data, communicating outcomes, and understanding and eliminating bias through the evaluation process.

Participants must successfully complete both days of the Academy and pass the assessment at the end of day 2. If both components are not met, the participant must pay to retake the entire academy and assessment. There is no remediation process in place by ISBE.

Please bring a charged device AND a charger. Also, you will need to bring the Danielson Framework & Rubric with Critical Attributes and Part 50 rules. You will need to use a google-linked email address to access surveys, etc.

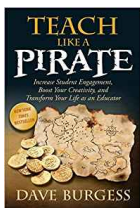

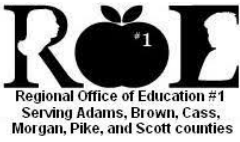

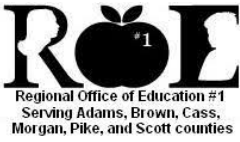
