From IEPs to behavioral intervention plans and functional behavioral assessments, Brandon Wright will point out the red flags associated with the IDEA's least restrictive environment requirement in the context of student behavior. In this workshop, Brandon details what the law and regulations say about behavior and how the case law has interpreted these requirements, focusing particularly on the new and newly proposed rules related to physical restraint, time out, and other behavioral interventions. And, in addition, you'll learn how to prepare for other behavior-related issues, including restorative practices, continuing implementation of SB100's discipline requirements, manifestation determinations, and the role of Section 504.
