RETURN TO LEARN PLAN 2022-2023 ROE#1 (Alternative education programs)

In accordance with the Illinois State Superintendent of Schools July 9, 2021 declaration, ROE#1 safe school and alternative education programs will be open fully for in-person learning for all student attendance days for the 2021-22 school year and beyond. Remote instruction will only be made available for non-vaccinated or vaccine ineligible students who are under quarantine as directed by the local health department or the Illinois Department of Public Health. Absent an order from the Illinois State Board of Education and/or the Illinois Governor's Office, ROE#1 safe school and alternative education programs will be in operation in accordance with the CDC's updated (July 9, 2021) *Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in Kindergarten (K)-12 Schools*, also adopted by the IDPH on July 9, 2021. These guidelines include the following:

Schedule

All students will be provided a full day of in-person instruction, five days per week, following their approved school calendars.

Masks

As per order of the Governor:

- Indoors: Mask use will only be required by all students and staff regardless of the vaccination in conjunction with any mandated policy of Jacksonville School District 117 and Quincy Public Schools.
- Outdoors: Mask use is recommended, but not required, outdoors during activities (e.g., participating
 in outdoor play, recess, breaks, PE, sports, extra-curricular activities) that involve sustained close
 contact with other people who are not fully vaccinated, particularly in areas of substantial to high
 transmission.
 - School staff are to model support for and encourage students to be supportive of people who choose to continue to wear a mask as a personal choice or because of a personal medical reason.
 - o School staff will not discriminate against anyone including, but not limited to: a staff member, employee, or a student for their decision to wear or not wear a mask.
- Unless exempt by CDC order, all passengers and drivers are required to wear a mask on school buses.

Social Distancing

The CDC, IDPH and ISBE recommend social distancing in schools of at least 3 feet where possible.

- To the extent possible within school and classroom structures so that it does not exclude students from full day in-person learning, school staff are to help students commit to physical distancing as much as possible by:
 - o arranging furniture, desks and tables to model and reinforce physical distancing of at least 3 feet and movement;
 - o providing assigned seating for students and encourage students to remain in these seats to the greatest extent possible; and
 - o developing marked paths of travel in classrooms and corridors.

- School staff will maximize physical distance as much as possible when moving through food service lines and while eating indoors. Aside from the cafeteria, additional spaces for mealtime seating will be utilized when available and feasible (e.g., weather permitting).
- Physical distancing measures are to be done in an equitable manner that does not perpetuate academic, racial, or other tracking (e.g., separating people into fully vaccinated and non-fully vaccinated cohorts).

Screening

Parents are responsible to self-screen child(ren) and should not send child(ren) to school when displaying COVID symptoms. Employees are responsible to self-screen and not come to school when displaying COVID symptoms. Parents and visitors should self-screen and follow these guidelines, as well.

Vaccinations

- Vaccinations will not be required. Respectful of peoples' varying levels of vaccine confidence, those
 who want to get vaccinated against COVID-19 can visit <u>vaccines.gov</u> to find out where they can get
 vaccinated in our community.
- Individuals will not be required to disclose their vaccination status. Parents, students and staff may
 wish to voluntarily disclose their vaccination status to avoid a mandatory quarantine for close
 contact with a COVID positive person.

Hand Washing/Hygiene

Frequent handwashing and attention to good personal hygiene is a simple and effective way to combat the spread of all viruses. Frequent handwashing opportunities will be a point of emphasis for ROYALS students and staff. Hand sanitizing stations will be placed for easy access.

School staff will monitor and reinforce frequent handwashing and respiratory etiquette by

- o continuing to teach handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds;
- o assisting young children with handwashing:
- o reminding everyone in the facility to wash hands frequently;
- o using hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol (for teachers, staff, and older students who can safely use hand sanitizer) when handwashing is not possible;
- o continuing to teach respiratory etiquette (e.g., covering coughs and sneezes); and
- o providing adequate handwashing and hand sanitizer supplies that are safely stored (up, away, and out of sight of young children and used only with adult supervision for children under 6 years of age).

Facilities

Frequent and thorough cleaning and sanitization of classrooms and facilities, with special attention paid to frequently touched surfaces will be a focus of the ROE#1 custodial staff. Hand sanitizing stations will be kept stocked to help prevent any potential spread of COVID.

Contact Tracing and Quarantine

- Students and staff who have symptoms of infectious illness, such as influenza (flu) or COVID-19, should stay home and contact their healthcare provider for testing and care.
- COVID positive students and staff will have mandatory quarantines in accordance with local health department guidelines.
- Students and staff who have had close contact with a COVID positive individual will have mandatory quarantines in accordance with local health department guidelines.
- Individuals in our school environments who show symptoms of COVID-19 are to immediately report
 to or be escorted to isolation to be either sent home or be quarantined in the school's supervised
 safe area while awaiting pickup/evaluation. Students and staff are required to wear masks while in

- the safe area. Parents should ensure that ill students are picked up from school immediately. Ill students will not be allowed to utilize the school bus to return home.
- Student absences related to a COVID-19 isolation or quarantine will be recorded as excused. To
 ensure continuity of services, coursework will be available to students during this time. Students will
 have access to social, emotional, mental health support. Parents of students who have social,
 emotional, mental health, or other needs outside of an IEP or 504 Plan should contact their child's
 principal or the lead teacher to discuss needs.
- Remote instruction will only be made available for non-vaccinated or vaccine ineligible students who
 are under quarantine as directed by the local health department or the Illinois Department of Public
 Health as per guidelines of the CDC, IDPH, and ISBE.
- Absent COVID-related leave days previously provided by Federal law, staff absences related to a
 COVID-19 isolation or quarantine will be recorded in accordance with the ROE's sick leave policy.
 To ensure continuity of services, staff members should contact their principal to discuss support for
 social, emotional, mental health, or other needs.
- To the extent allowable by privacy laws and other applicable laws, school health care professionals
 will continue to collaborate with local health department officials to confidentially provide information
 about people diagnosed with or exposed to COVID-19, including making notifications to staff and
 parents as soon as possible regarding those who were in close contact of someone in the school
 who tested positive for COVID-19.
- Following quarantine, students and staff returning from illness related to COVID-19 are to call to check in with the school's health care professional.

Visitors

 Nonessential visitors, volunteers, and activities involving external groups or organizations with people who are not fully vaccinated are discouraged from visiting schools.

Collaboration with Public Health Officials

• District officials will continue to collaborate and consult with local health department officials throughout a pandemic on various logistics and decision-making including, but not limited to, quarantines, school health and safety protocols, screening testing, contact tracing, vaccine clinics, and emergency school closings.

Remote Learning

ISBE has mandated in person instruction for all students in all schools.

Plan Review

This plan will be reviewed by the Regional Office of Education #1 whenever changes in guidelines are published by the CDC, IDPH, or ISBE that substantially change public health guidelines, or whenever local circumstances – especially those related to an outbreak may warrant. School administration will continuously monitor local health data and consult with local public health officials to determine if policies/practices need revision.

Disabilities/Other Health Care Needs

- · Parents of students who need accommodations, modifications, or assistance related to COVID-19 safety protocols, disabilities, underlying medical conditions, or weakened immune systems should contact the principal. Medical documentation may be required.
- Staff members who need accommodations, modifications, or assistance related to COVID-19 safety protocols, disabilities, underlying medical conditions, weakened immune systems, or a sincerely held religious belief or practice (covered by Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964) should contact the principal to discuss the issue. Medical documentation may be required.
